What is Rail Trespassing?


- There's a surprising (or not surprising) number of official definitions
 - FRA "Trespasser is someone who is on the part of railroad property used in railroad operation and whose presence is prohibited, forbidden, or unlawful."
 - FTA "Trespasser is a person in an area of transit property not intended for public use (i.e., an unauthorized area)."
- Trespassing also includes suicide attempts





- Living/loitering in the rail right-of-way (homeless encampments)
- Shortcut/route convenience
- Criminal behavior
- Dropped/lost items
- Recreational activities, such as hiking or fishing
- Intoxication
- Distraction
- Self-harm intent
- Photography and selfies






Where Are They Trespassing?

TCRP 233 - Countermeasure Strategies

14 Countermeasure Strategies Grouped into Three Categories:

1. Engineering and Physical Measures

- Fencing, channelization, and barriers
- Landscaping
- Anti-trespassing guard panels
- Platform screen doors
- Surveillance and detection
- Lighting
- Approaching train alerts
- Track retrieval device




• Baltimore: Trespasser Detection




